CSU Campus and Course Selection Guidelines for 2025-26

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California State University (CSU) is the country's largest four-year university system with 23 campuses located throughout the state of California offering bachelor's and master's degree programs in over 350 subject areas. All campuses are open to exchange students although places at some campuses are more competitive. Some subject areas at various campuses are "restricted" (with limited places) or "impacted" (oversubscribed) which are closed to exchange students.

Read this document carefully as it will provide guidance on selecting appropriate CSU campuses for your degree.

1. Selecting CSU Campuses for Exchange. To find campuses that offer a specific subject area of interest, visit the website, http://degrees.calstate.edu/. Use the search engine to find which campuses offer a specific subject area **but do not use that website to apply for exchange**. This website is only meant to assist you with finding which campuses offer subject areas of interest. Then, refer to pages 3 and 4 of this document and CSU Campus Profiles on our website for listings of "impacted/closed" and "restricted/limited" subject areas for each campus. Once you have identified possible campus choices, visit the websites of the campus to search for subjects (known as "courses" at the CSU) and their descriptions. Applicants must not list campuses on their applications if the subject area they wish to study is "impacted" (closed). Applicants may list campuses if the study area they wish to study is" restricted" although applicants must be prepared to list more than one campus choice. Campuses have been placed in three groups based on how competitive the campuses are.

Applicants are asked to list up to four campuses on their applications depending on which campuses are selected and what they wish to study. See scenarios below. For scenarios A and B, you are strongly encouraged to list an extra campus on your application.

A. List at least two campuses on your application if both of the following conditions apply:

- Your first choice campus is from the **Green Group** and your second choice campus is from either the **Green Group** or the **Blue Group**.
- You are not listing any subjects that are listed as "restricted" on your application. Refer to pages 3 and 4.

B. List at least three campuses on your application if the following condition applies:

• Your first choice campus is from the **Blue Group** and your second and third choice campuses are from the **Green Group** and/or the **Blue Group**.

C. List four campuses on your application if any of the following conditions apply:

- One campus choice is from the **Red Group** regardless of ranking.
- You have listed subjects that are listed as "restricted" at any of your campus choices.

To help ensure your placement, one of your campus choices should be from the **Green Group** unless these campuses do not offer your subject area of interest.

IMPORTANT: Applicants should be prepared to **attend any of the campuses listed on your application**. While we make every effort to place students at their top campus choices, this cannot be guaranteed due to limited and/or competitive

places at some campuses, impacted/closed, or restricted/limited subject areas and other factors, e.g., academic match. Note that impacted and restricted subject areas can change at any time. If a campus cannot accept a student's application for any reason, we will contact the student's home university exchange coordinator to discuss another suitable campus. For this reason, we advise that you have alternate choices already selected to expedite your application in case this occurs.

2. Selecting Subjects (Courses). Applicants must list **eight** subjects that you wish to take for each campus choice. Applications without eight subjects listed will not be processed. Check that you meet prerequisites for the courses by referring to the "catalog" or "bulletin" for the campus (found on the campus website). Students can be prevented from taking a course if they do not have the appropriate academic background. Note that detailed syllabi are generally not available before the first day of class for the term that you are applying. Also note that courses listed on an application does not guarantee access to those courses. Therefore, it is critical that you are flexible with selection of courses.

3. Students who wish to study either business or film studies/production. Applicants who wish to study either business or film studies/production at the CSU as an exchange student 1) must have successfully completed the equivalent of one semester's worth of courses in that subject area based on full time studies, 2) must be enrolled in a degree program in that subject area at their home institution, and 3) must meet prerequisites for courses listed on their application. Students studying film production must also submit samples of their work in film production.

Students must carefully review the section below entitled "Impacted/Closed and Restricted Subject Areas". Note that places for these subject areas are very competitive and are limited to several campuses. Students should plan to take courses outside of business or film studies/production to supplement their studies in case courses are unavailable.

Students should avoid selecting more than one campus that lists courses as "Restricted" since there are limited offerings in courses for exchange students.

Note: Applications from graduate/postgraduate business students who wish to enroll in graduate level business courses are not accepted for exchange. Graduate/postgraduate students are welcome to apply for exchange if they agree to an undergraduate placement and take only undergraduate courses.

4. Graduate (Postgraduate) Students. Applications from graduate students are permitted if students are willing to accept an undergraduate placement, students select only undergraduate courses on page 2 of the application, and students are flexible about their campus choice. Graduate places are based on reciprocity and considered on a case by case basis, subject to restrictions and special permission. Students are advised to consult the exchange coordinator at their home university for more information. Note: Not all campuses accept graduate students, and it may not be possible for graduate students seeking an undergraduate placement to be placed at certain campuses (e.g., San Diego).

5. Advanced Studio-based Subjects. Students who wish to take intermediate and advanced subjects in architecture, dance, fine arts (animation, drawing, painting, sculpture) and music (composition and instruments) must also submit a portfolio (or audition videos for dance and music students) to demonstrate their ability. This may apply to other subjects not listed, as applicable.

6. Selecting Courses at the CSU: Impacted/Closed and Restricted/Limited Subject Areas. The following table lists impacted/closed and restricted/limited subject areas for each campus. Campuses must **not** be listed on an application if

the subject area is listed in the "Impacted (Closed) Subject Area" column. Campuses accept a limited number of applications in certain fields, which are listed below under "Restricted Subject Areas" as offerings can be limited. Applicants who are selected to attend a campus where there are impacted/closed courses disciplines will not be permitted to enroll in courses from those impacted/closed disciplines. Students should only list courses in which prerequisites have been met. Courses labeled under "Extended Education", Certificate and Credential Programs are closed to exchange students regardless of the campus. The list below is subject to change without notice.
