# Korea - IP Bulletin 2013-14

### Introduction

The IP Bulletin is the International Programs "catalog" and provides academic information about the program in Korea.

## **General Information**

The CSU International Program in Korea is arranged through the Office of International Affairs of Yonsei University in Seoul, Korea. Yonsei is the oldest university in Korea, dating to the founding of a hospital to teach and practice Western medicine in 1885. It combined with Chosun Christian University in 1957 to form Yonsei. From its beginnings as a small college, Yonsei University has grown into a dynamic, internationalized, comprehensive university with 22 colleges and 18 graduate schools where over 28,000 students pursue degrees through a variety of academic programs.

### Academic Calendar

The academic year at Yonsei consists of two semesters. The Fall Semester runs from the beginning of September to mid to late December. The Spring Semester starts the beginning of March and ends mid to late June.

Note that the term in between the first and second semester at Yonsei is NOT part of the IP program. Consequently, any courses taken during this term will be at the student's expense and will NOT be reported to the student's home CSU campus by the OIP.

## Academic Program

Most students enroll in courses taught in English at Yonsei in addition to the Korean language courses which all students are expected to take each semester. Students who are proficient enough in the Korean language may, with permission, select courses from the regular courses offered at Yonsei.

CSU students have two study options to choose from:

Option A. Study Korean language in the afternoon. In the afternoon, students study Korean language for six units each semester. Students select three other courses (for a total of nine units) offered by university departments and the Underwood International College at Yonsei. Students who choose this option must take a minimum of 15 units each semester.

Option B. Study Korean language in the morning. In the morning, students study Korean language for six units each semester. Taught in an 'intensive format', this course begins three weeks after the beginning of the regular Yonsei semester and ends before the end of the regular semester. Students take other two courses (for a total of six units) offered by university departments and the Underwood International College at Yonsei. Students who choose this option take 12 units each semester, as an exception to our policy. This option is limited up to 50 exchange students per semester.

Any exceptions to the above schedule or any academic policy must be approved by the Office of International Programs. To request an exception, email the CSU office through <csuyonsei@gmail.com>.

#### **Course Codes and Levels**

At Yonsei, course codes are made up of three letters to represent a department or college, followed by four digits usually beginning with 1, 2, 3 and 4. Typically, courses numbered 1000 to 1999 are foundation and introductory courses and are designed for first year university students. Language and physical education courses numbered 2000 to 2999 are also lower division. Other courses numbered 2000 to 2999 can be lower division or upper division depending on the specific course and department through which the course is offered. Courses numbered 3000 to 3999 or 4000 to 4999 are upper division courses (with some exceptions depending on course content). Students seeking upper division credit should plan to take courses numbered 3000 to 4999.



## **Academic Reporting**

In addition to units and grades, the OIP reports each course attempted to the student's campus by reporting the title of the course taken and the CSU home campus department in which the course is closely related. This method of reporting means that students will need to furnish course descriptions, syllabi, and other course materials to their advisors in order to apply for credit towards specific major, minor, or general education requirements. Students should expect to complete campus-based forms (petitions or course substitution requests) with the assistance of their advisor(s). If courses are not needed for specific degree requirements, then it is usually not necessary to complete any other forms.

## **Course Offerings**

Courses taught in English are offered throughout the various departments at Yonsei University. Course information is available through Yonsei University portal. No ID or password is necessary to access the portal. Please refer to additional instructions on Page 4.

Below is an example of courses offered for exchange students last year. Note that the course list below is for reference purposes only since course titles and codes can change each year. To access courses offered in 2013-14, students are advised to check the Yonsei portal webpage regularly for updated information.

## **Course Information**

To find course information on the Yonsei University website, follow the instructions below.

Go to http://portal.yonsei.ac.kr/main/indexe.jsp

**Confirm if the webpage is written in English**. Otherwise click on the 'English' button at the top right corner.

Click on "Course Catalogue and Syllabus: Undergraduate & Graduate" under "The Main Portal Service"

(New page opens...)

There are boxes that include some categories through which you can find courses. **Click each box** and choose relevant category to find courses of interest. Then click the search button.

For example, in order to find the course of "Beginning Korean Language 1", choose "Undergraduate Programs", "Study Abroad Course", "Korean Language", and "All" in each box. Then click search button. You will see some Korean courses including "Beginning Korean Language 1",

Or you can use search engine using the box which includes Course Code, Title, Instructor, etc. Click search button after putting the Course Code, Title, etc. in the blank.

For the example above, choose Course Code in the box. Enter "IEE1001" in the designated blank field. Then click search button.

(The course will appear...)

After finding the course you want to find, **click on the blue arrows to see the Course Descriptions and Syllabi**. The second one is for course description and the third one is for syllabi.

Course listings and information for any given semester are listed on the Yonsei website a few months before the start of the semester. To get an idea of courses offered, refer to the course list from the previous year and check their website on a regular basis for updated information.

Note: Yonsei offers approximately 300 courses per semester in English. To find which college is providing these courses, click on each college in the search engine. When you are in a certain college course list, check 'reference' on the right-hand side of the list for a course to see if it is offered in English or if it is available only for Korean students.
